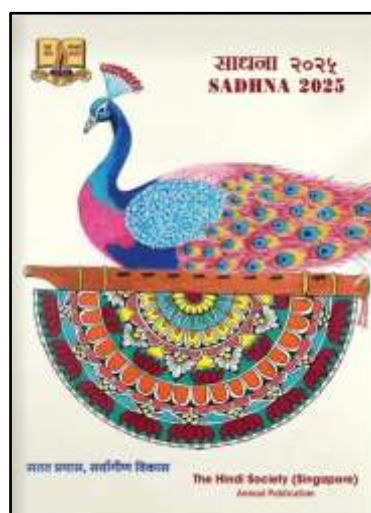

HINDI LANGUAGE ASSESSMENTS:

Assessments for Non-Tamil Indian Language (NTIL) students are conducted by the Board for the Teaching & Testing of South Asian Languages (BTTSAL). Students with a Mother Tongue Approval Letter for Hindi may sit for the assessments conducted by BTTSAL.

There will be no examinations for Primary 1 and 2; these levels will have formative assessments only. There will be no mid-year examinations for all primary and secondary levels.

Primary 1 & Primary 2:

Formative Assessments are conducted for the students for Semester 1 and Semester 2. Qualitative descriptors will be provided to report the student's progress. For 2026, the assessment policies remain the same for P1 & P2 levels.

IMPORTANT EXAMINATION AND ASSESSMENT-RELATED ANNOUNCEMENT - 2026

Exams During Term Break

Please be informed that WECs will remain operational on Saturdays during the Term Break. If an exam or Weighted Assessment is scheduled on any of these Saturdays, it will apply to both ISPP and WEC students.

Parents are kindly requested to keep this in mind when planning holidays and booking travel tickets.

Guidelines for Valid Reason (VR)

You must email your VR request to hindi@hindi-society.com at least ten (10) working days before the examination date, with all relevant supporting documents attached. Please copy (cc) your child's Hindi teacher in the email.

- Late, unsupported, or same-day requests will not be considered.
- Please do not assume that a VR will be granted. Kindly wait for official confirmation; we will respond as soon as practicable.
- The process for VR mark calculation is confidential. If VR is approved, your child will not be marked absent and will not be penalised in their results.

The recognised grounds for VR are:

1. Direct School Admission commitments
2. Mathematics Olympiad participation
3. Robotics competition (International level)
4. Certified medical reasons
5. Bereavement of immediate family members (parents, siblings, grandparents)

Absence Due to Medical Reasons

- If your child is unwell on the day of the exam:
- Please submit a Medical Certificate (MC) dated on the day of the exam to the teacher immediately. The MC must clearly state that the student was unfit to attend the exam.
- If your child requires special arrangements for health or other reasons, please inform us well in advance. Last-minute requests cannot be accommodated.

USE OF DICTIONARY (Examination Guidelines)

- Students are allowed to use approved dictionaries for Paper 1.
- Approved dictionaries are mono-lingual and must be stamped by the respective Community Groups.
- Bi-lingual dictionaries are strictly not allowed during examinations.

MOCK ASSESSMENT

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR PSLE STUDENTS

Parents are requested to submit a clear photo of their child's PSLE results to the Hindi teacher by 12th Dec 2025. This is mandatory as it is required for Subject-Based Banding (SBB), and we need to submit the students' results to the Board.

Please note that all student results are kept strictly confidential. The results will also be used to consider students for the HSS Award Ceremony.

Transfer from PSLE to Secondary 1

If the student is continuing with HSS in Secondary 1, please submit the following supporting documents:

1. Transfer Form P6 to Sec 1 and PDPA form
2. Status proof (e.g. NRIC/FIN/Passport/Dependant's Pass, etc.)
3. PSLE Certificate and Result Slip
4. School posting message/email/document
5. GIRO Form (if not submitted earlier)

Parents are requested to submit a clear photo of their child's O-Level results to the Hindi teacher by 22 January 2026. This is mandatory as we need to submit the students' results to the Board. Please note that all student results are kept strictly confidential. The results will also be used to consider students for the HSS Award Ceremony.

Transfer from Secondary 4 to A-Level

If the student is continuing with HSS in A-Level, please submit the following supporting documents:

1. Transfer Form Secondary 4 to A-Level
2. Status proof (e.g. NRIC/FIN/Passport/Dependant's Pass, etc.)
3. O level Certificate and Result Slip
4. School posting message/email/document
5. GIRO Form (if not submitted earlier)

Result Submission & Award Eligibility

We request parents to share their child's results with the teacher before the deadline, so that they can submit them to the HSS office. Submitting your child's results is important for several reasons, including data collection, eligibility checks for SBB, and consideration for student awards.

Students who achieve AL1 in the PSLE, A1 in the O-Level, and A in the A-Level exams will be invited to the Award Ceremony. Certificates will be emailed to students who achieve AL2 or AL3 in the PSLE and A2 in the O-Level exams.

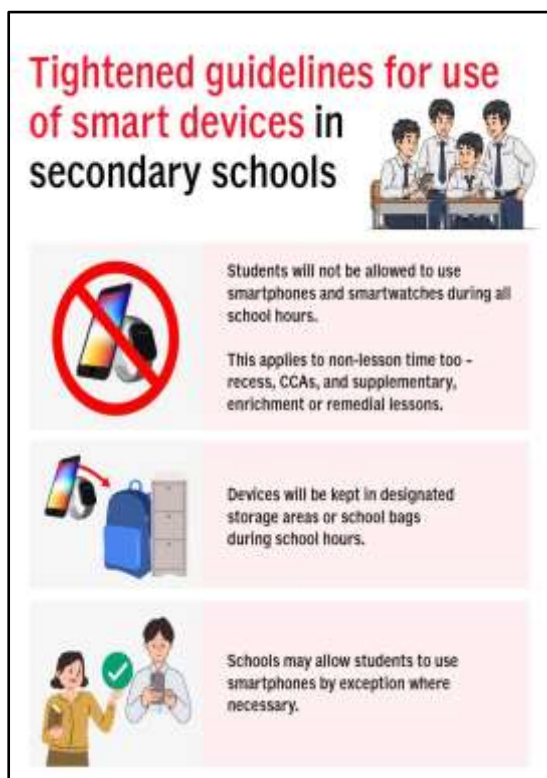

VAPING POLICY

We are committed to providing a safe and healthy learning environment for all students. Therefore, vaping, the use of e-cigarettes, and the possession of any vaping devices or related products are strictly prohibited on school premises and during all school-related activities.

- Students must not use, possess, or distribute vaping devices, e-liquids, or any related accessories.
- Any student found in breach of this policy will face disciplinary action in accordance with the school's Code of Conduct.

MOE TIGHTENS SMARTPHONE RULES



From 2026, students will not be allowed to use smartphones or smartwatches during all school hours, not just during lessons.

This means devices must be kept away during recess, CCA, supplementary, enrichment and remedial lessons as well. This move builds on existing MOE guidelines and is aimed at helping students develop healthier screen habits, stay more focused in class, and spend more time building face-to-face friendships.

Parents are encouraged to start guiding their children on responsible device use both in school and at home.

NTIL ATTENDANCE FOR WEEKEND STUDENTS

Please note that NTIL attendance for weekend classes are submitted to the mainstream schools.

We have noticed ongoing issues with students being absent repeatedly without valid reasons or prior notice. We kindly request all parents of weekend Centre students to submit supporting documents (e.g. medical certificates, school letters, competition letters, etc.) whenever their child is absent, so that teachers can submit the weekly attendance and documents on time.

From 2026 onwards, if a student is absent on Saturdays, supporting documents must be provided.

NOTES FOR FEES

1. The registration fee is a one-time payment for all new students.
2. The miscellaneous fee is a per-annum fee, payable in January.
3. The examination fee is a per-annum fee, payable in January.
4. Fees must be paid by 15 April for Semester 1 and by the end of August for Semester 2.

We strongly encourage parents to pay the fees via GIRO, in keeping with the practice in mainstream schools. From 2026, all fees shall be paid via GIRO. A \$20 charge will apply for payments made through alternative methods to cover administrative costs.

Opting for GIRO not only helps streamline the payment process but also ensures smoother and more efficient transactions. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter.

To continue providing the high-quality education and services that our students deserve, we will now be including the applicable GST in our fees.

We have made this decision only after careful consideration, and it is necessary to ensure the long-term sustainability of our programmes. We appreciate your understanding and continued support as we work to maintain the standards and care that you expect from us. Thank you for your trust and partnership.
